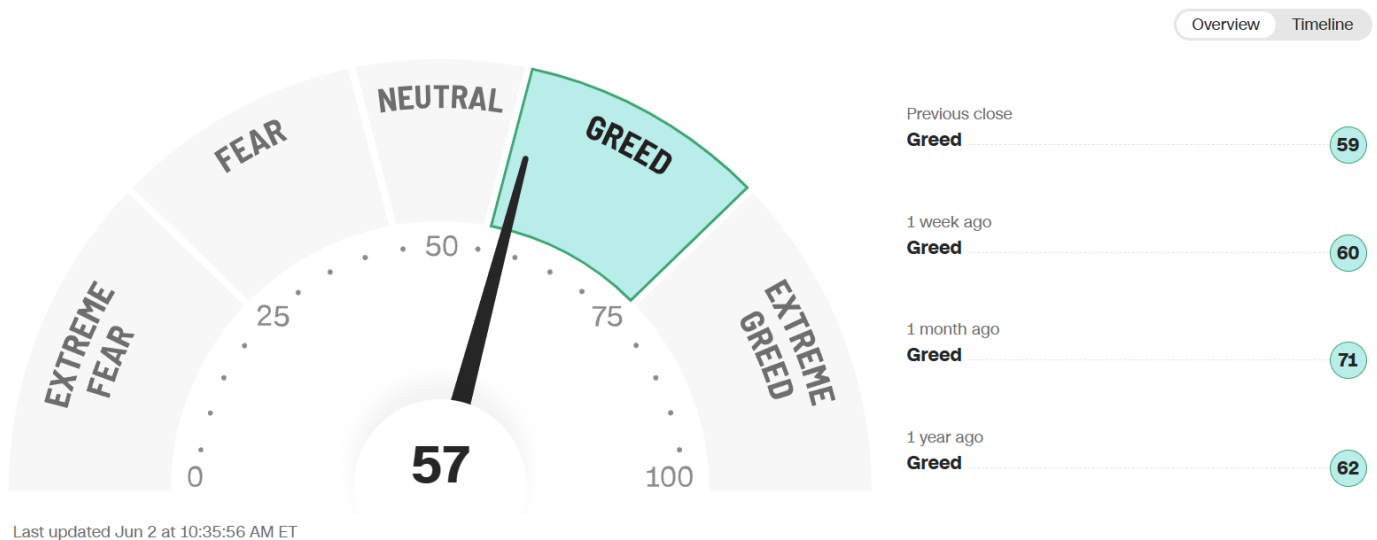

Despite Iran's threats to continue blocking the Strait of Hormuz and exert further pressure in the region, US President Trump stated that negotiations with Iran are proceeding at a "rapid pace."




The Taipei International Computer Show (COMPUTEX) opened, with AI infrastructure concepts continuing to be a focus of attention. During his keynote speech, Matt Murphy, CEO of US chip design company Marvell Technology (MRVL), received support from Nvidia (NVDA) CEO Jensen Huang, who publicly stated his optimism that Marvell has the potential to become the next technology company to surpass a \$1 trillion market capitalization.

Cleveland Federal Reserve Bank President Beth Hammack stated on Tuesday that current inflationary pressures are excessive and their trajectory is worrying, and the Federal Reserve may need to take swift action to address them.









































SpaceX, owned by Elon Musk, is negotiating with Wall Street investment banks handling its IPO, hoping to pay extremely low fees. However, even with significantly reduced fees, the banks responsible for the listing are still expected to receive approximately \$500 million from this record-breaking IPO.

Redbook reported that U.S. same-store sales rose 9% year-over-year in the week ending May 30, the same growth rate as the previous week. Sales of graduation-related items, apparel, footwear, and women's accessories were the main drivers. Redbook noted that customers remain highly value-driven and price-sensitive. As of the final sales week in May, May sales were up 8.9% compared to May 2025, exceeding the 8.6% target.

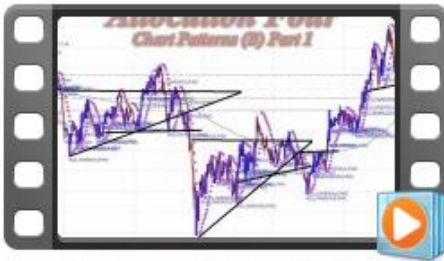

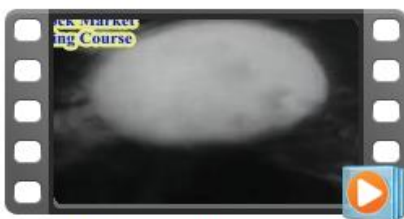

Times are a-changing

It's an ever-changing world. Technology always belongs to the US and now still has focus in the US, but Asia always can give you a surprise. Please refer to the Top 10 capitalization table, TSMC ranks number 6 in the world, already surpassed TSLA long ago. Samsung ran into number 10, surpassed META and just after TSLA. SK Hynix ranks number 13, already surpassed BRK.B from God of Stocks Warren Buffet.

In Taipei, there is a COMPUTEX Forum. They said that it is the largest computer show in the world, but the US said it is the largest in Asia. Anyway, both of them have their standpoint, but what investors should mind most is MRVL, DELL, NVDA and TSM, they are all on or near record high, and TSLA is falling.

It's no doubt that the focus of the world should be in Silicon Valley, but Asia is always releasing some surprises. Even though the threats in Hormuz Strait still exist, even the Federal Reserve warned of rate hikes, investors are having their focus on MRVL because of the deal between MRVL and NVDA. Mind that in the G2 meeting in Beijing, Jensen Huang did not attend the national dinner in People Assembly Hall, instead he went to the main street to enjoy his snacks.

He went to Taiwan, because of MRVL and of course DELL and AMD. He is the CEO of NVDA which has been ranked no 1 in the world for a long time. A lot of famous universities wanted to invite him to Commencement Day for a speech, but he only attended 2. In the US it's the California Technology Institution, in Asia, it's the National Taiwan University. Because most of the engineers of TSMC are from the National Taiwan University, he also wanted to recruit them. Post graduates from that university are locked up one year ahead of their

graduation and never afraid of replacement of AI. Normally, when entering into large firms, they would send them to the US for training first, but now to National Taiwan University and TSMC headquarter in Taiwan first.

What should investors do? At least for these days, put an eye on Taiwan, and after that go back to Silicon Valley but don't forget Korea and Taiwan.

For those that want to find stars of tomorrow, always try to find in the top 20, for the top 10 are already too high, like GOOG should wait for refilling of jumping gap which is done with an anti-falling hammer. NVDA rises because of the COMUPTEX in Taipei. Remember NVDA is the King of Kings and GOOG is Lord of Lords. According to British monarchy ranking, King is higher than lord, knight, duke, count ... and everything, but according to the Bible, the Lord above is higher than King on earth. So just treat them neck to neck. AMD rises because Mother Su, the CEO is a cousin of Jensen Huang.

When out of the top 20, it is not easy to find out. There are still some brilliant stars like ARM (ranking 27), PLTR (37), DELL (54), QCOM (68) and MRVL (73) all rising because of the COMPUTEX Forum.

TSM has the most ideal rising trend which is 45 degrees, for it has enough time for digestion and is said to be the next NVDA. AVGO is having record high and also said as the next NVDA. But for MSFT, it is going to break through the 250-SMA and now is undervalued. For ARM, DELL and MRVL need to wait for refilling the jumping gap. PLTR is my heaviest stock focus, it is having a pullback and best time to buy.

Anyway, the market is at a very high level of 9 consecutive weeks, already broken the Fibonacci series of 1,1,2,3,5,8 which is known as 9 Flying Daggers, that market should retreat on the ninth week, but already said it is not so accurate in bull market, for normal it is crazy, in bear market is it very accurate. Therefore, there is another alternative method which is to use the following ratio to buy the ETF which is 4 QQQ, 2 VOO and 1 DIA, or can be 3 QQQ when capital limits.
